competition. The topics were different for different classes. Large number of entries from all classes were recorded online the same day.

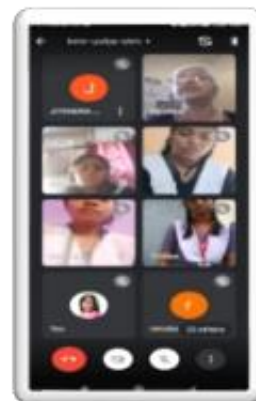


On the other hand, the staff members also participated whole-heartedly in the essay writing Competition on the topic “Swachhata during Pandemic” (bilingual).

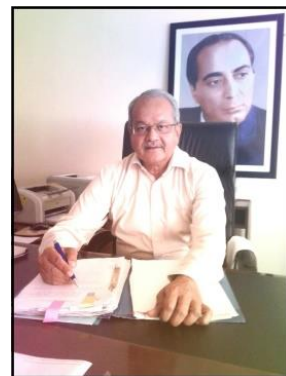

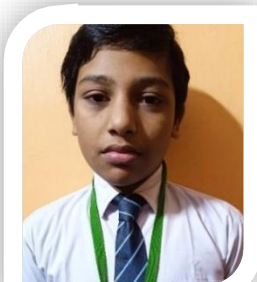

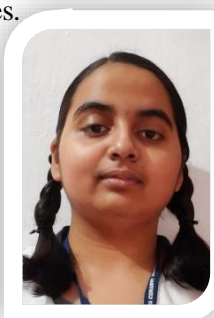

Patel - A Freedom Fighter

"Many leaders of India must remember that before India and her sons right in the century the independence struggle was led by Mahatma Gandhi."
Bhaskar Vallabhbhai Patel was an Indian politician who served as the first Home minister of India and the first deputy prime minister of India. He was a barrister and a very active member of the Indian National Congress. He was born in Nadiad, Gujarat. His father's name was Thakurdas Patel and his mother's name was Laliba. Vallabhbhai Patel had 5 siblings. He was highly influenced by Mahatma Gandhi's views on non-violence. He was an ardent follower of Gandhi's principles. He strongly emphasised the need for unity of the Indian masses in order to achieve independence from the British rule. He played the most pivotal role in the integration of India as he was the one who convinced almost all the princely states to join India to become a part of India, had India's independence. He became popularly known as the Iron Man of India. Since 2014, his birth anniversary 31st October is usually celebrated as "Rashtriya Ekta Diwas" i.e. the National Unity Day in India. Bhaskar's health deteriorated rapidly in the 1950s. He suffered a massive heart attack and died on 15 December 1950 at Birla House in Bombay.

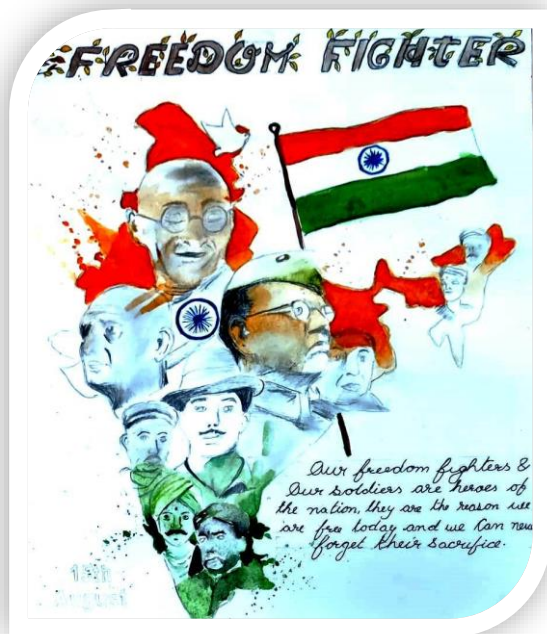

क्रान्तिकारी चंद्रशेखर आजाद
भारत को स्वतंत्र कराने में देश के क्रान्तिकारियों का बहुत बड़ा योगदान है। क्रान्तिकारी दैन इकैती, लाला लाजपत राय की मौत का बदला लेना हो या प्रजातन्त्र पार्टी की स्थापना देश के क्रान्तिकारियों ने अपना सर्वोच्च योगदान दिया है। देश के इसी क्रान्तिकारियों में चंद्रशेखर आजाद का नाम भी आता है। देश के महान एवं लोकप्रिय स्वतंत्रता सेनानी चंद्रशेखर आजाद का जन्म 23 जुलाई सन् 1906 को मध्यप्रदेश के झाबुजा जिले के क्षाबरा नामक स्थान पर हुआ। उनका पूरा नाम चंद्रशेखर भीमराव तिवारी है। के वर्षों में वे आंध्रप्रदेश के ब्रह्मयोग आंदोलन से जुड़े। 1926-27 में गिरफ्तार कर लिया गया और जेल के सशक्त प्रसूत किए गए। उन्होंने वहाँ अपना नाम 'आजाद', पिता का नाम 'स्वतंत्रता' और निवास 'जेल' बताया। 1928 में जब आन्दोलन हुआ उसमें लाला पार्षा से लाला लाजपत राय की मृत्यु हो गई। जिसके बाद आजाद ने जेल से रफाट कर भारत का फैसला किया, सुखदेव राजगुरु और भगत सिंह के साथ मिलकर। लेकिन उन्होंने जेल से जेली सेल में भी मार डाला। जिसके बाद उनके सभी परिवारों को गिरफ्तार कर लिया गया, लेकिन आजाद वहाँ से भाग निकले। लेकिन उनकी लोकप्रियता लीक हो गई। इसलिए उनके आन्दोलन में आजाद पुलिस से लड़ते-लड़ते घायल हो गए। आजाद की वरुद्ध, मे आखिरी एक आली बनी जिसे उन्होंने अपने अंत को मार ली। लेकिन उन्होंने ब्रिटिश पुलिस के सामने आत्मसमर्पण नहीं किया।

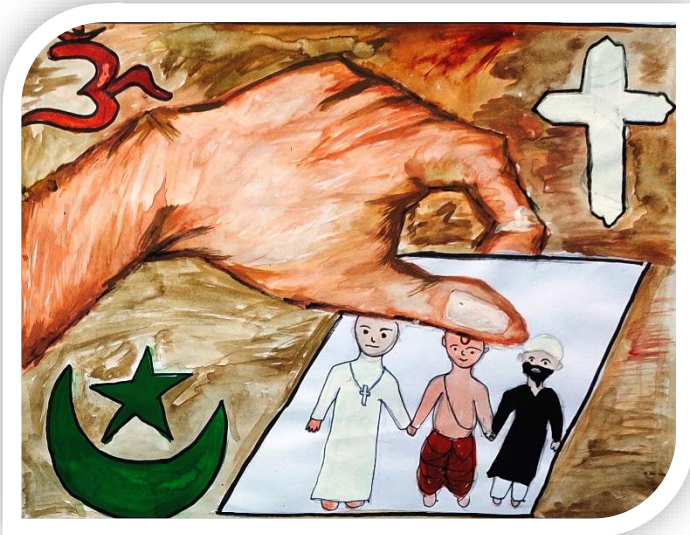
Subhash Chandra Bose

- Subhas Chandra Bose was a major revolutionary leader of the Indian freedom struggle.
- He was born on 23 January 1897 in cuttack city of Orissa.
- His father's name was Jankinath Bose and mother's name was Prabhavati.
- His father Jankinath Bose was a famous lawyer of cuttack city.
- We address Subhash Chandra Bose by the name of Netaji of India.
- Subhash Chandra Bose gave the slogan "You give me blood, I will give you freedom."
- He was Subhash who first addressed Mahatma Gandhi as the father of the Nation.
- Netaji believed that freedom from the British could be achieved by fighting.
- In 1920 AD, Subhash Chandra Bose passed the examination of 'Indian Civil Service'.
- Netaji was elected the president of Congress in 1938.
- On 3 May 1939, Subhash founded a party called Forward Bloc within the Congress.
- On 1 September 1942, Subhash founded the 'Azad Hind Fauj'.
- In 1942, Netaji also married an Austrian woman named Emily Schenkel.
- Netaji died in a plane crash in Taiwan on 18 August 1945.
- When Netaji died, he was only 48 years old.
- Subhas Chandra Bose was a true son of Mother Bharat, an immortal fighter of the freedom struggle.

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
