# **CLIMATE CHANGE- IT'S UPON US**

These are some of the contrasting and devastating facts about climate change.

1. In 2019, Iceland hosted a unique ceremony- a funeral to mark the death of its first Glacier, Okjokull killed due to climate change. Though the glacier had already been dead for ten years, Iceland

decided to hold the funeral only recently to warn everyone about the devastating impact of climate change.

2. The raging bushfires in Australia (2019-20) were other such examples of a natural Catastrophic event causing death, devastation and displacement not just of humans but also of animals in countless numbers. The wildfires have killed an estimated 1.25 billion animals, caused more than 100 billion worth of damage to the Australian economy, and released upwards of 900 million tonnes of CO2 equivalent in emissions in the atmosphere.

3. Two fifth of the global population line is region that are warming by more than  $1.5^{\circ}$ C.

4. Global surface temperature in June 2021 was fifth - highest for the mouth in 142 years.

5. The recent report of the inter-governmental panel on climate change (IPCC) confirms what we already know and can see on the world around us from wild fires because of extreme heat to devastating floods because of extreme rain events to tropical cyclones because of the changing temperature between the sea and land surface.



6. Science is telling us that the relative efficiency of sinks- the earth's natural cleaning system, the oceans forests and soils - will go down in the coming years as emissions continue to rise.

7. According to the IPCC report, Earth's average surface temperature rise will cross  $1.5^{\circ}$ C in the next 20 years, and  $2^{\circ}$ C by the middle of the century, if there is no drastic reduction in Green House Gas Emissions (GHG).
